Over the past few weeks I've had some feedback which indicates that not everyone is happy with the way our range officers our conducting their duties and after getting some feedback, it is felt that the following needs to be addressed.

Opening times - the current club opening times are:

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We politely request that members do not enter the range until the range officer for that night has given the all clear to do so. Anyone arriving early may be asked to wait.

It is requested that all members please bear in mind that range officers are volunteers who also have other commitments outside of the club and, at times, may be delayed slightly. All services provided by our range officers (which I'm sure we all appreciate) are provided on a best-efforts basis. Please also bear in mind, the number of range officers are lower than what they used to be.

If you feel you can lend a hand and volunteer some time every now and then, please get in touch. Conditions of being a range officer are laid out below.

- 1) A range offer must have a valid FAC in order to possess a full set of keys in order to satisfactorily run a Monday or Friday session.
- 2) A member can be a range officer without a valid FAC but will only be suitable to run Wednesday evenings as only a door key will be provided.
- 3) A range officer must be able stay at the club until the last person has finished, as the range officer is normally required to ensure everything is secured, switched off and the building locked up and secure.
- 4) Range officers are there to control the range and activities and not to shoot.
- 5) Cover may be required at short notice for other range officers.

A rota would be provided and any night which is not convenient can be swapped on the basis that anyone swapping will normally be expected to repay their night, this keeps it fair for everyone else.
